- Is there a local restaurant in your city that you would recommend to a traveler?

- Have you had food you considered to be out of this world?

portion

- Do you prefer large portions at a restaurant?
- Have you ever been to a restaurant famous for large portions?
- Why do expensive, classy restaurants serve smaller portions?

- Whose recommendations do you trust the most?
- Do you like to give recommendations?
